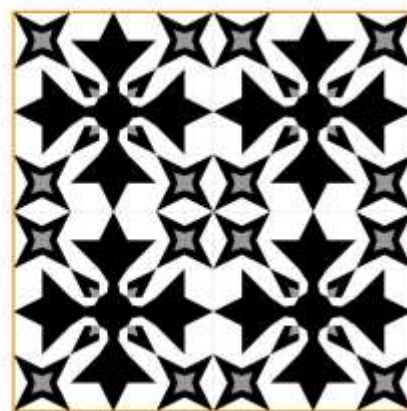

And because Blue is my color of the year, here is a lovely blue colorway example!



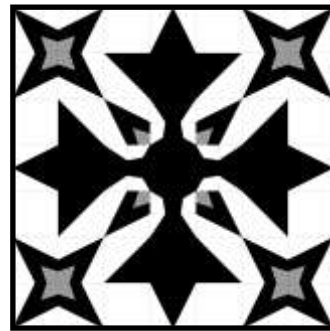

Neutrals Color Tutorial

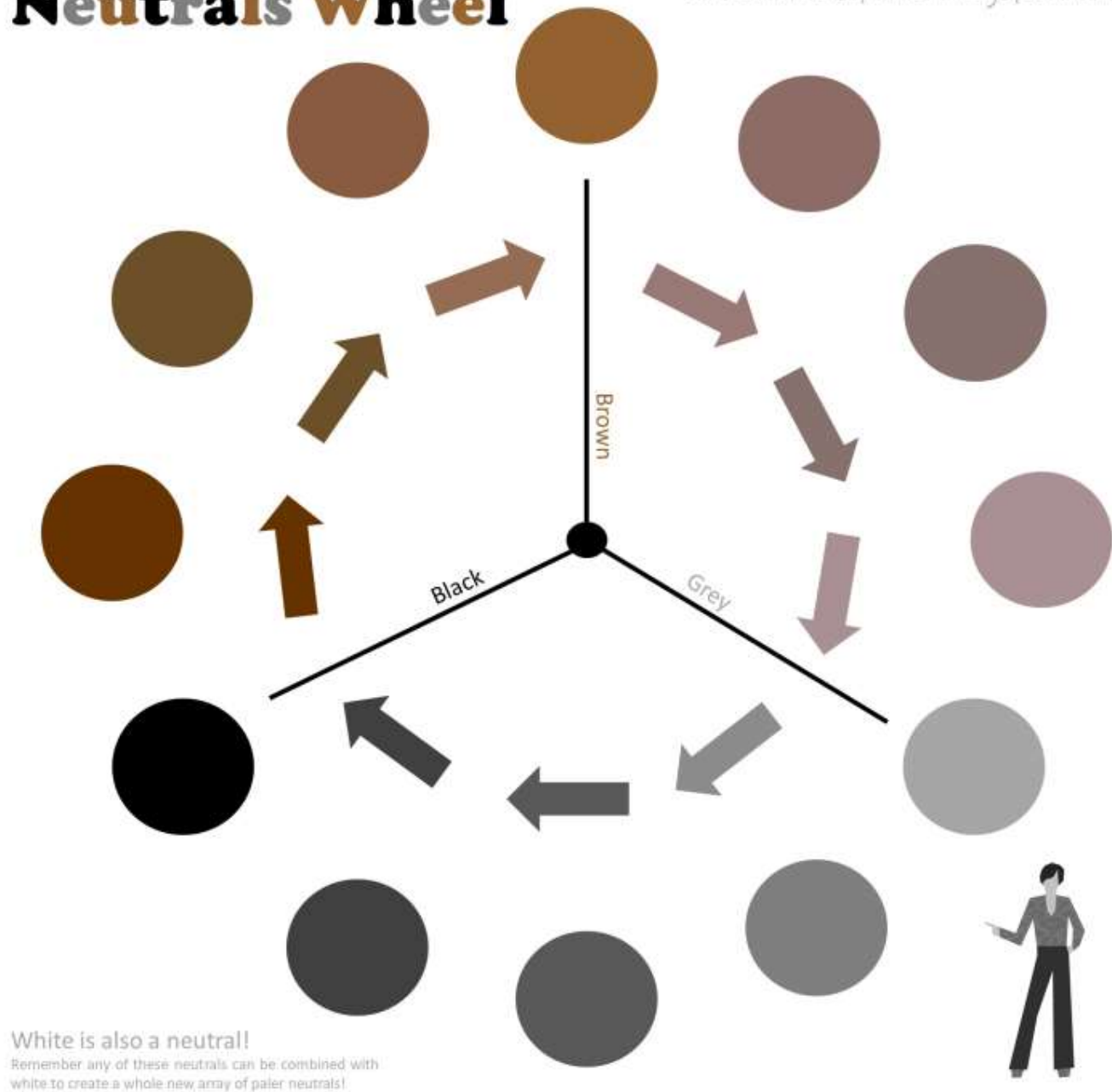

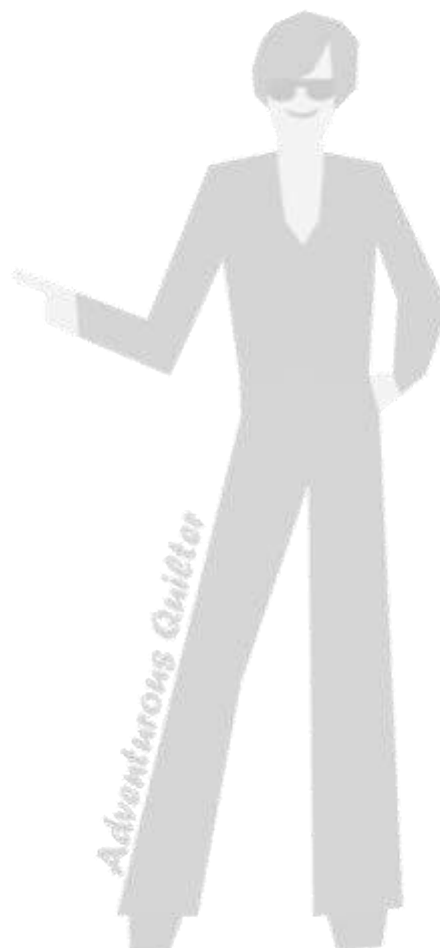

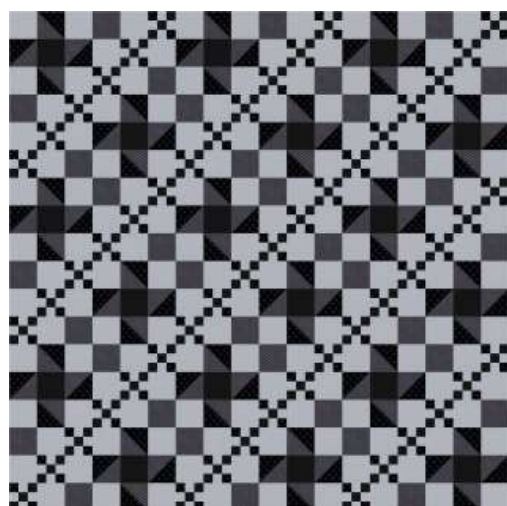
I like to explain neutrals using this graphic; like a color wheel it shows the variation available in the darker tones of the neutral palettes.

The neutrals like other colors occur in a vast array of shades. These are shades of grey and brown. Along with black and white they can create an endless choice whether you are using them as background fabrics or feature fabrics in a quilt project.

Shades of Grey



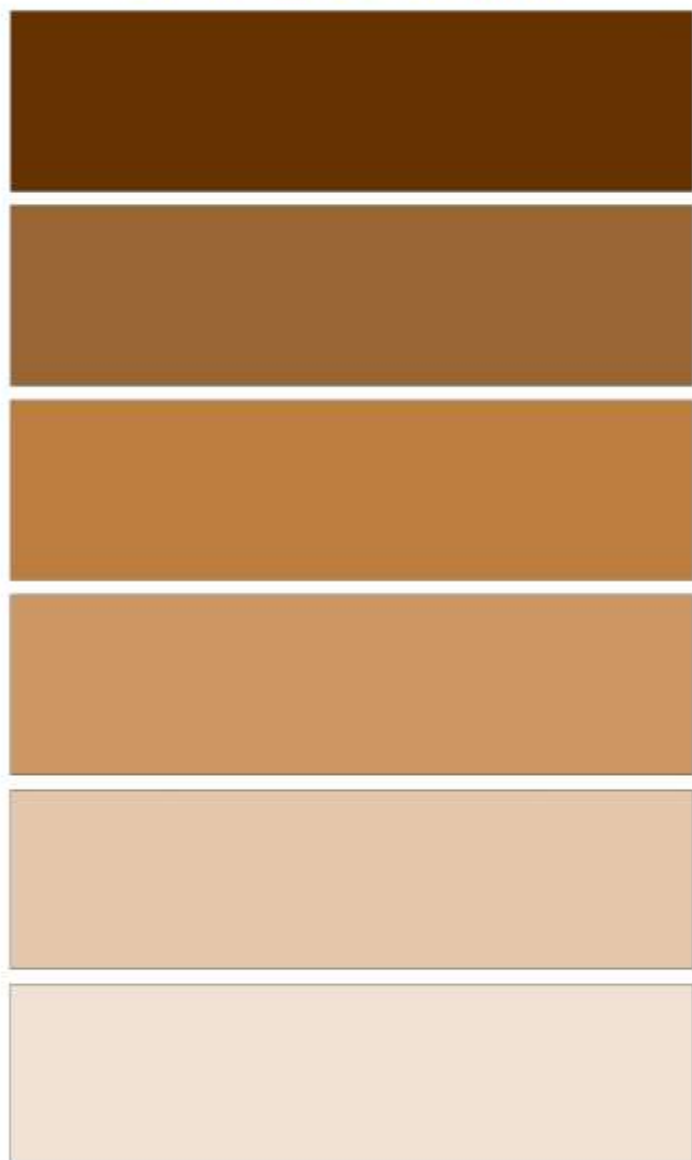
The basic greys are fundamentals of the neutral palettes.

The basic browns are also fundamentals of the neutral palettes.

White helps us achieve paler versions of any color including black and brown. But when it gets truly tricky to understand neutrals is when a color palette includes elements of both grey and brown...

The grey/browns are a vast array of shades



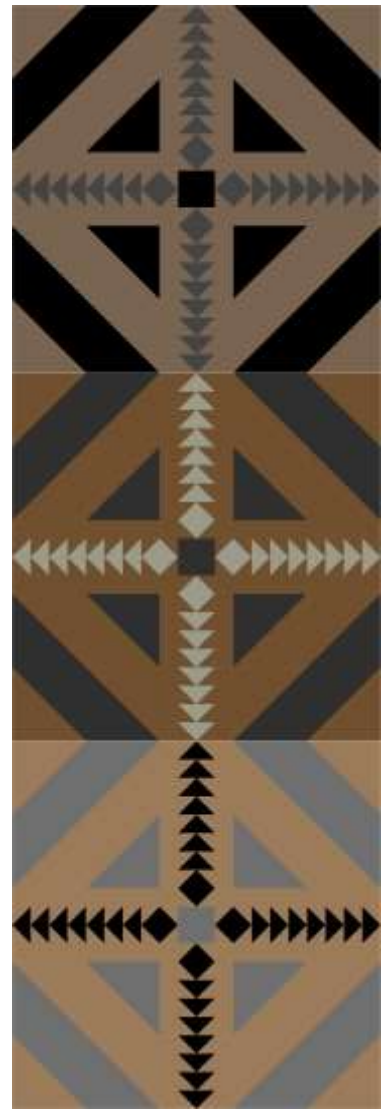
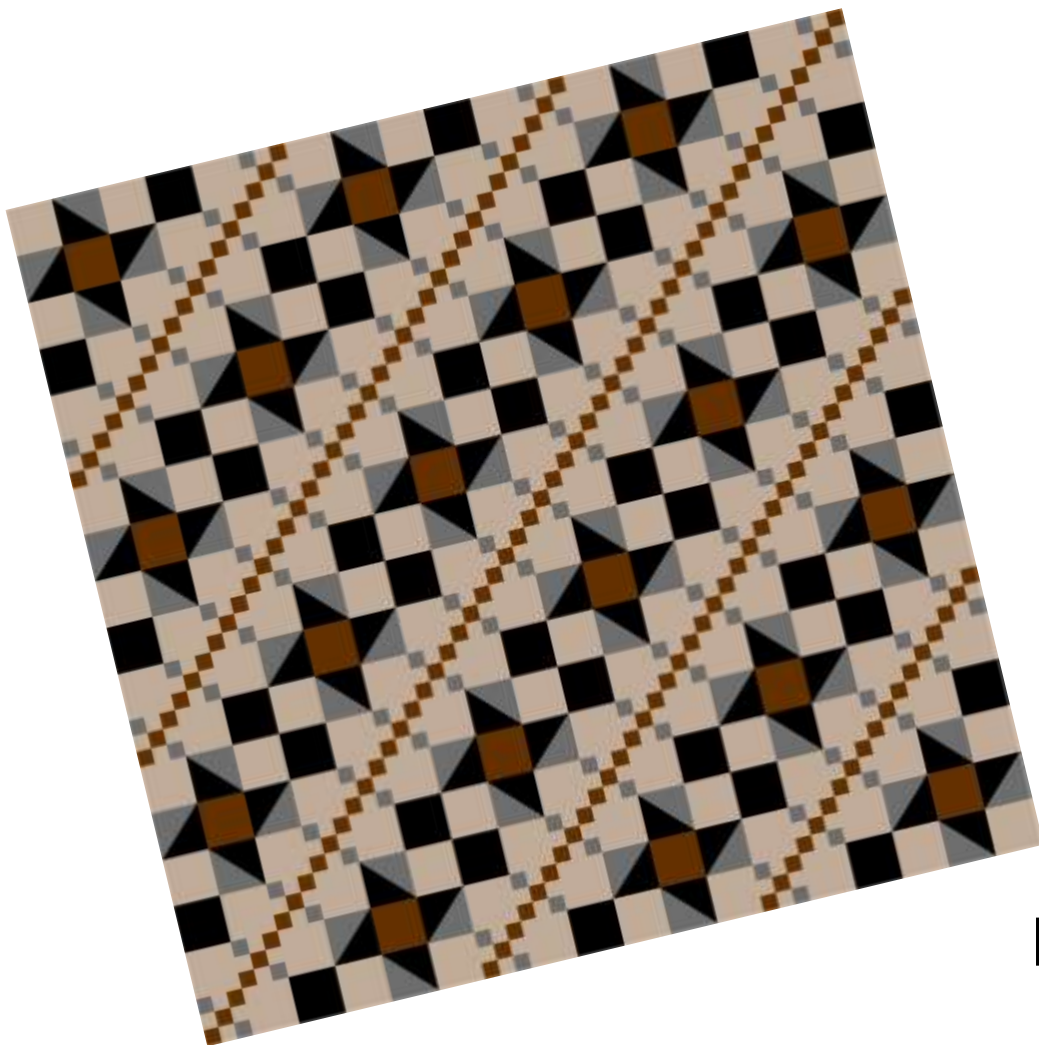
These colors occur in our natural world in many places but perhaps the easiest image to conjure in your mind is grey/brown in mushrooms!

Shades of Grey/Brown

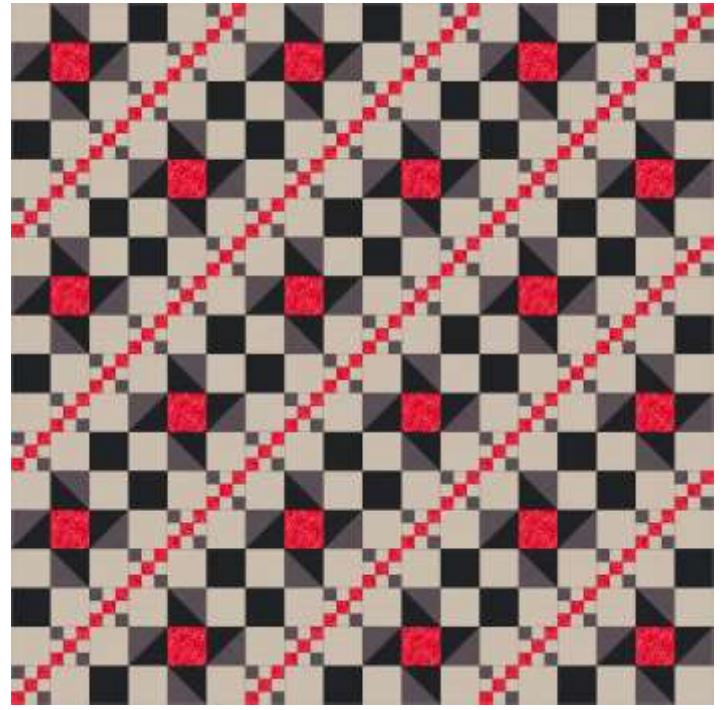


Can you combine all three of the dark neutrals in one quilt?

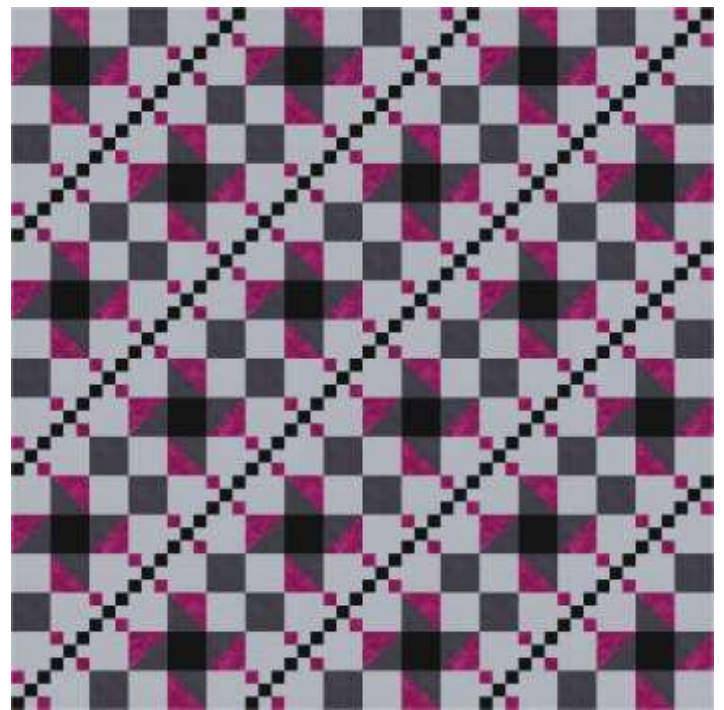
Of course you can! There are no rules when it comes to use of color in quilts!



BUT ...



Your quilt might have more pizzazz if you add another color that can really pop out of all that neutral!



So what about cream???

Cream can be derived from caramel brown and white.

Caramel brown has a hint more yellow than a color we perceive as standard brown.

Caramel Brown to Cream

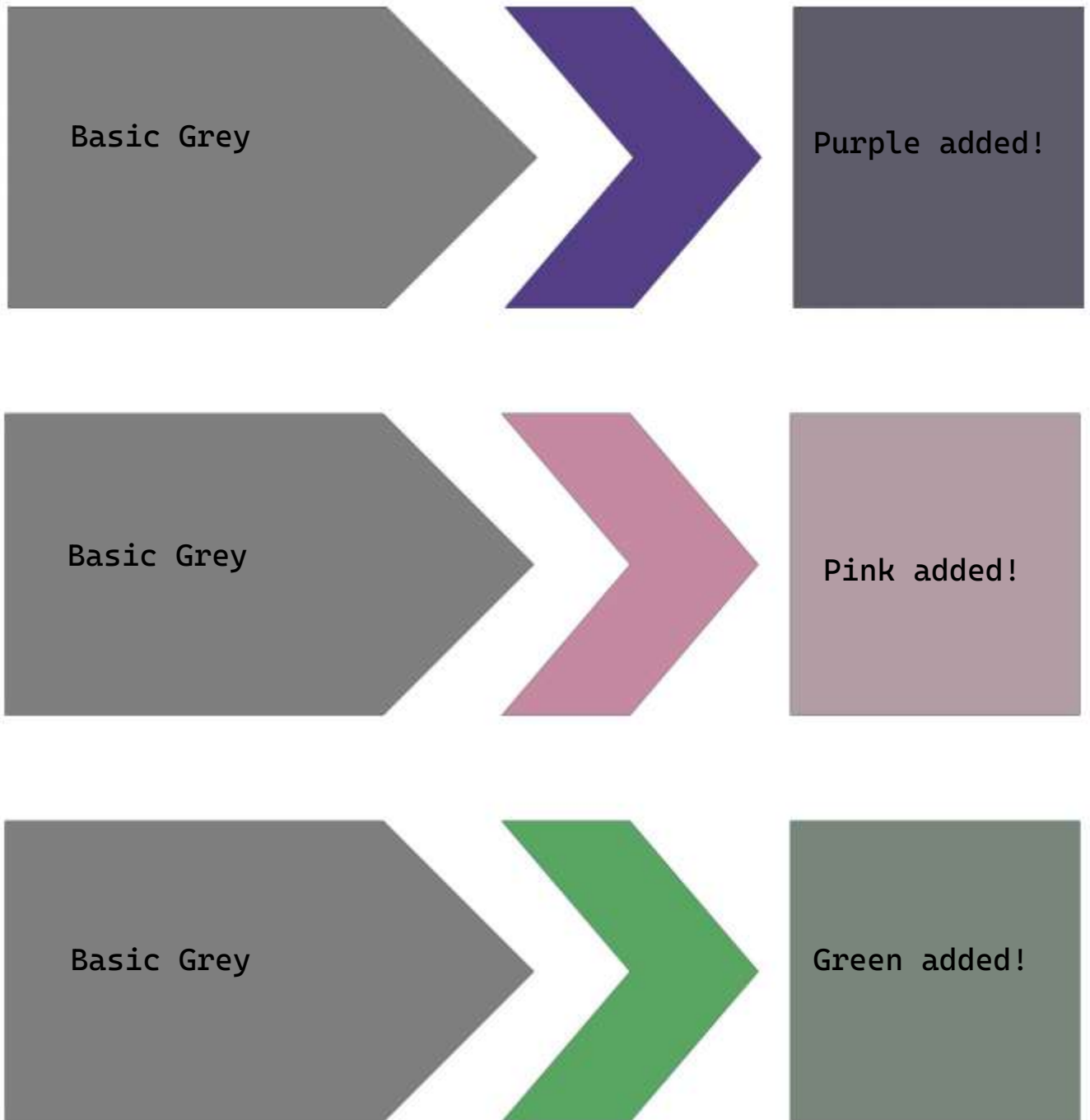


These colors occur in our natural world in many places, think of cinnamon, sand and parmesan.



If you have ever sorted a vast array of fabrics or fabric scraps you will always find a fabric that doesn't 'play nice' with other fabrics of that color! **Why??**

Within each color there are a vast array of variations available. For example lets look at grey:



So there are an endless array of colors available which is why solid fabric manufacturers make color cards to help enable you to more effectively differentiate between similar colors.



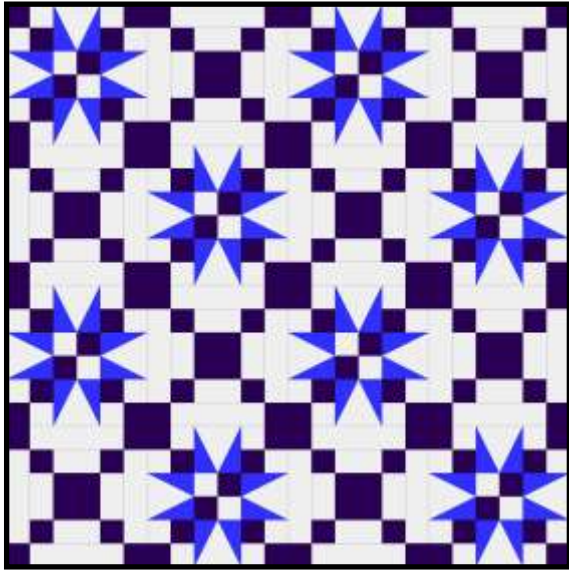
In 2021 I ran out of the creamy floral background fabric I used for this quilt center but wanted to make the quilt bigger...

So, pulled out my solids color card and chose a solid fabric the same color as the cream background of the floral fabric and used it in the outer borders! It worked out fabulously!

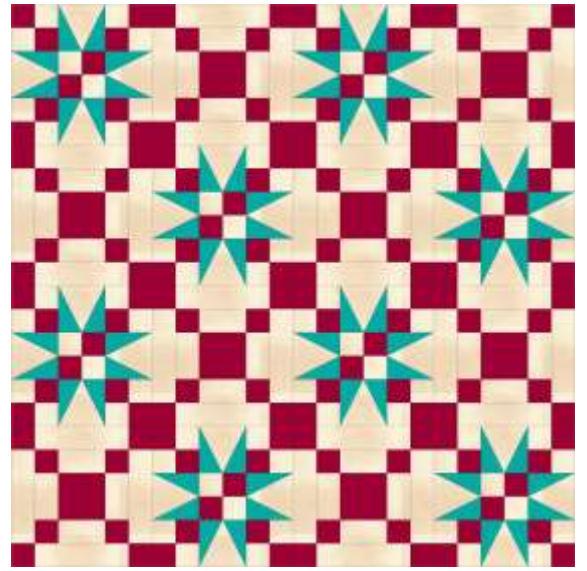
So, learning about color theory with neutrals can help you make effective choices about fabric use in quilt making!



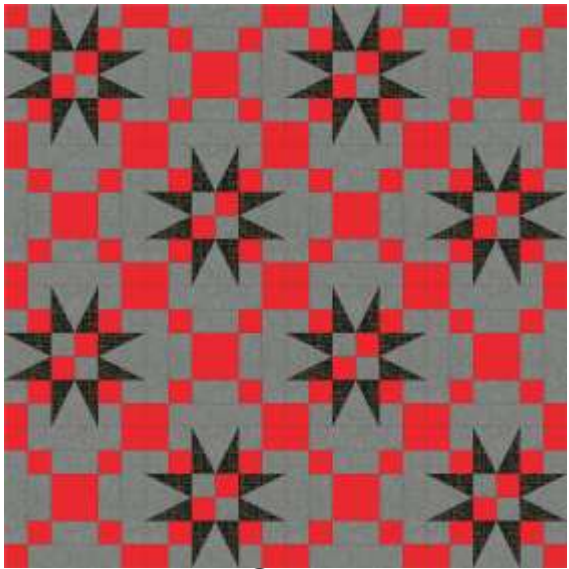

Summary

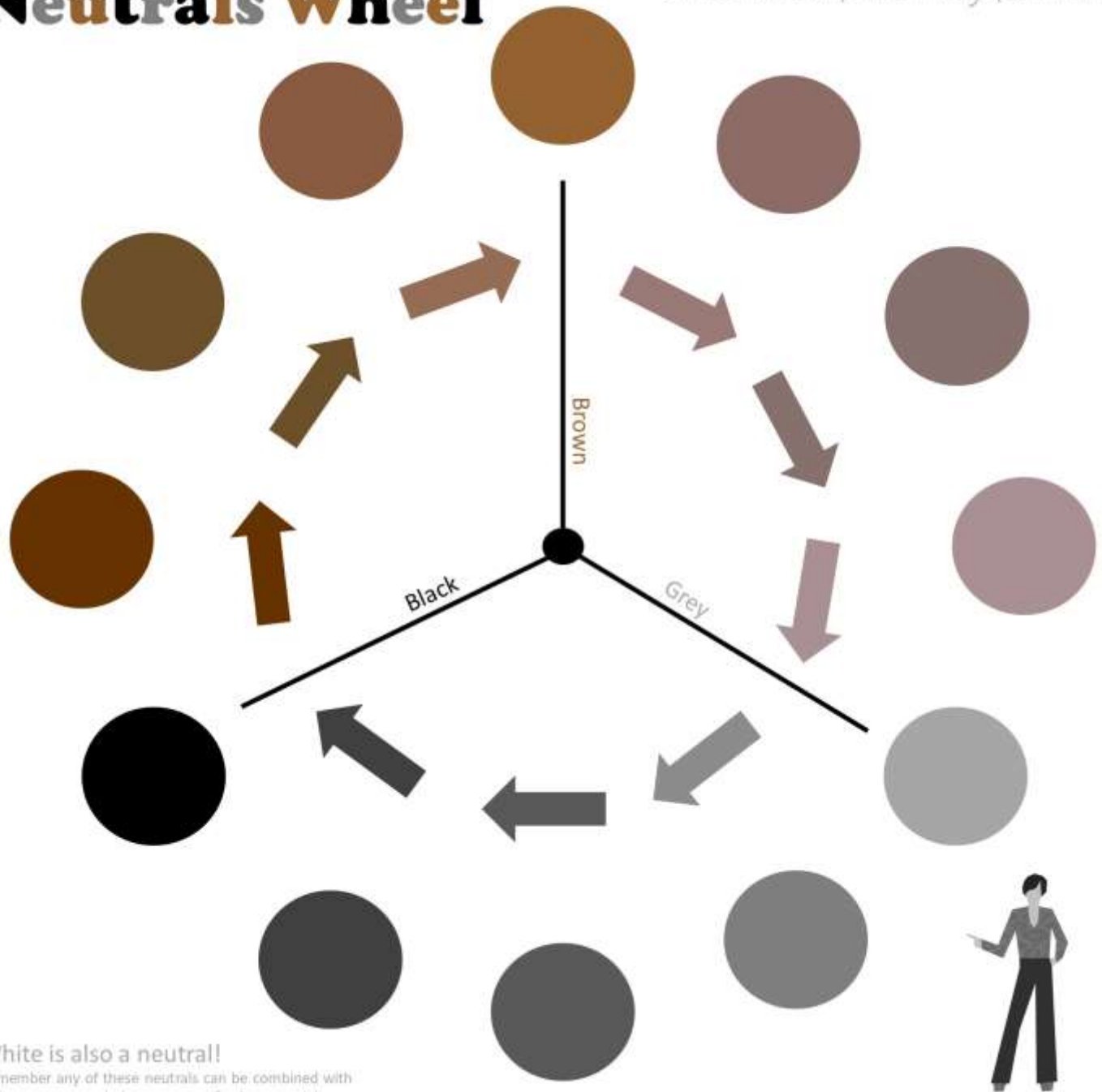
- * Neutrals incorporates black, grey, brown, white, cream, beige and every tone created using those base neutrals
- * Non-neutrals (colors) can be added to neutrals during the manufacturing process to make new neutrals e.g. what we often refer to as “purpley grey” is grey with a hint of purple added
- * Neutrals offer a vast array of tones to create quilt color palettes that are truly delightful.
- * Neutrals can be used as background fabrics or feature fabrics

In modern quilting many fabrics fall into the neutrals category. It is a vast playground of amazing fabrics we can draw inspiration from and incorporate into our projects.
