



Ideas for how I might incorporate blue into my 2023 projects:

- Sew projects using only blue scraps with neutral backgrounds
- Make blue a feature color in quilts that have only 2 or 3 colors
- Make a wall quilt in blues and hang it in my studio to remind myself to focus on blues!
- Choose a room of my house to make projects for (master bedroom: pillow shams, pillowcases, cushion covers, bed runner, table toppers, coasters, etc.)
- Pull all my precut blue scraps and design projects to use them
- Quilts I design in 2023 might even primarily feature blue
- Blue will feature as the focus color for my digital content




Make a small lap quilt or repeat the design to make a larger quilt!






This is the 35" quilt block you can work towards making!







This array of quilt elements is fabulous when the block design is repeated & there are 4 layout options!

Simple design elements combine to create spectacular blocks!








Think your scraps are too small for this project?

Patterns are being provided in greyscale so you can choose whatever colors you have available.






And because Blue is my color of the year, here is a lovely blue colorway example!





You can use the same block patterns to create fantastical borders for your block!








Quarterly Quilt Adventures Block Design




Use my Scrappy Flying Geese block in a project!

This block is the perfect blend of scrappy & non-scrappy!









Quarterly Challenge FPP Pattern




